

We have included a voter registration application form with this letter.

We are sending you this voter registration application to ensure you receive an opportunity to register to vote when you interact with the Department of Human Services. The National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) requires this service.

Applying to register or declining to register to vote <u>WILL NOT</u> affect the amount of assistance you will be provided by this agency.

If you are already registered to vote at your current address: You do not need to complete the voter registration application and re-register. You may check your voter registration at www.VotesPA.com.

If you would like to register to vote or update your voter registration record to reflect an address, name or party change: You must complete <u>ALL</u> of the required information on the voter registration application and mail or deliver the completed voter registration application to your local county board of elections (addresses listed on the voter registration application) or you may return it to your local county assistance office. If you return the form to your local county assistance office, the office at which you register will remain confidential.

You must be a U.S. citizen in order to register to vote.

If you believe someone has interfered with your right to register or to decline to register to vote, your right to privacy in deciding whether to register or in applying to register to vote or your right to choose your own political party or other political preference, you may file a complaint with the Secretary of the Commonwealth, Pennsylvania Department of State, 302 North Office Building, Harrisburg, PA 17120, or call the Department of State toll free at 1-877-VOTESPA (1-877-868-3772).
