Subject: Former Foster Care determination and YDC

Question:

Policy at 312.8 Former Foster Care indicates that the Federal definition of foster care does not include placement in a detention facility, secure treatment facilities, psychiatric facilities and forestry camps. Children placed with facility codes 73 and 74 upon release from placement between the ages of 18-21 are not eligible in this category. August 2017 Release Q&A question under Former Foster Care-Phase 2 indicates that when the system runs RTE automation for in state foster care, the system only looks at the PC31/33/35, J 31/33/35 and PCN 31/33/35 and does not look at the facility code when opening PC 40 via automation. The PC 30 category is still in the MA cascade dated 03/15/18.

- 1. When a paper application is received, is the CAO to look for the facility codes of 73 and 74 prior to authorization of the PC 40 category?
- 2. Is the PC 30 obsolete or a category of last resort?

Response By: Division of Family Assistance/DHS Date: 7/11/18

- Yes, the CAO should review to see if the client had facility code 73 or 74. PC 40 is not the appropriate category and program status code for a client that was in the YDC or YFC. The YDC/YFC is responsible to notify the CAO of discharge from placement. However, per OPS 050408, a paper application is required if the client was not a former cash assistance or Medicaid recipient at the time of placement. (MEAH 305 Appendix E & MEAH 312.8)
- 2. PC 30 is still valid and is the appropriate category and program status code for a child discharged from the YDC/YFC. See OPS 050408 for additional information.
