Description of Violation

Resident #1 was sent to the local ER due to harmful and threatening behavior on psychiatrically hospitalized due to lack of bed availability. Resident #1 stabbed a staff person with a pair of scissors on 6/7/20 which resulted in a 302 hospitalization. The home did not report the initial incident that occurred 6/3/20.

Resident #2 had a bottle of Melatonin Nature Maid 5 mg. tab. located in the bathroom room with no prescription and was unlocked. This resident resides with spouse who is not capable of managing medications and has access to this medication.
